Introduction

This booklet is designed to guide Croydon parents and carers through the admissions process for September 2019 and help to make an informed choice of secondary school.

We have included information on the wide range of secondary schools in Croydon as well as information on some of the schools in neighbouring boroughs. Croydon schools' admissions criteria can be viewed at www.croydon.gov.uk/education/schools-new/secondary-schools.

Before you make your final selection, we recommend that you visit the schools you are interested in. Details of open days and evenings can be found in this booklet.

If you live in Croydon, you need to apply online at **www.eadmissions.org.uk** no later than 31 October 2018.

Completing the form

All Croydon residents must apply using a Common Application Form (CAF). The form should be completed online at www.croydon.gov.uk/admissions.

The form allows you to select **six** schools, which you must name in your order of preference. We recommend that you use all your preference options as your child can only be considered for a place at the schools you have listed on your application.

For further information on how to complete your application see pages 14-15.

Online applications close at 11.59pm on 31 October 2018. Applications received by this date will be accepted and treated as on time.

Admissions criteria

Read the admissions criteria for the schools that you are interested in to know how they prioritise applications. A summary of schools' admissions policies can be found online at www.croydon.gov.uk/education/schools**new/secondary-schools** and on each school's website. Find out the furthest distance offer made for a school for entry in September 2018 (please see pages 19-20). Some schools will have maps on display at their open sessions showing the location of homes of pupils offered places at the school last year.

Please note, there is no guarantee that for the September 2019 admission, a school will offer to the same distance as they did in the previous year, as each year offers are subject to the number of applications and where the applicants live.

If you wish to have an indication of the distance between your home and a school, please go to www.croydon. gov.uk and follow the 'find it' link on the home page. It must be emphasised that the measurement given by this site will not always be identical to that from the council's geographic information system (GIS). This is because this website is a general one for measuring distance to a range of council facilities, and is not set up to measure for school admissions purposes. Under the schools' admission policies, the distance is measured in a straight line from the child's home to the designated main entrance of a school using geographical reference points as provided by the National Land and Property Gazetteer. The 'find it' site doesn't give measurements to three decimal points either. Therefore, you should not assume that because the measurement from your home to school given by this site is the same or less than the minimum distance to which a

school has admitted applicants in previous years, you will be offered a place. If there are other criteria under which you could apply for a school, as well as distance, it is recommended that you do so.

Expressing preferences for schools

The law requires admission authorities to meet parental preference wherever they can. It is not possible to guarantee a place at the school of your choice but you do have the right to express a preference or preferences. Most parents are successful in securing a place at one of their preferred schools but, as there is only a limited number of places available in each school, some parents are disappointed.

All admission authorities (i.e. local authorities, academies, voluntary aided schools and free schools) must provide information which explains how they decide which children will be offered places if they receive more applications than they have places available. This information is normally called 'admissions criteria'. The admissions criteria will vary from school to school (please refer to www.croydon.gov.uk/education/schools-new/ **secondary-schools** for schools' admissions criteria)

How are places allocated?

If you have listed six schools in preference order and all six schools are in a position to offer a place, the system will automatically seek the highest preference, i.e. your first preference, and make you an offer at this school. All your lower preferences are withdrawn as these are no longer required.

If you listed six schools in preference order and preferences three, four and five are in a position to offer places, the system will automatically seek the highest preference, i.e. your third preference, and make an offer at this school. Your lower preferences four and five are withdrawn as these are no longer required. Your higher preferences one and two are automatically placed on the waiting list for reconsideration should any places become available. Any further offers will continue to be made in accordance with the schools' published admissions criteria.

Will I have a better chance of getting my first preference than someone who lists it as a second or lower preference?

No. All preferences are considered equally against the schools' admissions criteria. The preference order will only be used when it is possible for more than one school to offer you a place. This is called the Equal Preference System.



The local authority will always try to match your highest preference but many schools are oversubscribed and receive more applications than they have places available. To give you the best chance of getting into a local school, it is very important that you use all six preferences and include other schools in your area, as schools will use their straight line distance criterion as the final factor once all their higher priority places have been allocated.

If you only apply for one school and a place is not available, you can only be offered a school with places left once all other parental preferences have been considered. The school offered could be some distance from your home.

Failing to list other preferences on your form can result in disappointment, as we can only consider the preferences you have listed on your application form.

How much information from my application will be passed onto my preferred schools?

The list of schools you include on the Common Application Form is confidential.

Each school will only be given the information it needs to consider your application.

Schools are not told where you named them in your preference list.

The preference order of schools which are situated outside the Croydon local authority will be released to the local authority which maintains the school(s) so the highest preference can be determined in cases where a child is eligible for a place at more than one school in that local authority's area.

Considering a school outside Croydon?

You can apply for a school in another borough. As a Croydon resident, Croydon Council still processes your application. You must include the school as a preference on your Common Application Form. Schools within three miles of Croydon's boundary are listed at the back of this booklet. For information on schools further than three miles please contact the relevant local authority

Considering a private/independent school?

Independent schools have their own admissions arrangements and are not included in our admissions scheme. If you are considering applying to an independent school please contact the school directly.

Do not list these schools on your Common Application Form.

Changing your mind

After the closing date **31 October 2018** it will not be possible for you to add new school preferences to the Croydon Common Application Form. If you do make changes after the closing date, your application may be regarded as late. For a detailed explanation of how late applications will be processed please read the paragraph below.

Late applications

Croydon will only consider late applications in the initial allocation round if the application is late for a good reason but is submitted before 10 December 2018. Examples of what may be considered a good reason include: when a single parent has been ill for some time or has been dealing with the death of a close relative; or a family has just moved into the area or is returning from abroad (proof of ownership or tenancy agreement will be required in these cases). Other circumstances will be considered and each case will be decided on its own

If you submit an application or change your existing preferences, or order of preferences, after 31 October **2018** but before **10 December 2018** with good reason for doing so, the application will be treated as on time. Otherwise your application will be treated as late and this may jeopardise the possibility of your child being offered a place at one of youFr preferred schools.

Applications which are late for no good reason and those that are received after 10 December 2018 but before 1 March 2019 will not be considered in the initial allocation round but will be allocated available places after all on time applications have been processed. Where a place cannot be offered at a preferred school, your child will be offered the nearest school to the application address with available places.

Change of address

Croydon Council **must** be notified of any changes of address by 10 December 2018 so that the new address can be used if needed to prioritise your preferences for schools under the distance criterion. Failure to do so will result in your application being considered from the previous address and your child possibly being denied a place at a preferred school.

All changes of address will be thoroughly investigated to ensure there is a permanent commitment to the new address. Changes of address can only be considered when Croydon Council receives documentary evidence that you and your child are resident in the property and able to prove you have no connection with your previous address i.e. the new address is not a temporary arrangement to access a preferred school. Examples of documents to be provided are a letter from a solicitor confirming the date of completion (not exchange of contract) for the new place of residence or a copy of the new tenancy agreement stating the commencement date, together with evidence of residence, for example a utility bill.

If your address changes after 10 December 2018, you must still notify the local authority immediately, providing documentary evidence as described above, so that your new address can be taken into account when determining your child's position on schools' waiting lists after National Offer day (that is after 1 March 2019).

Child's permanent address

The child's address should be that of the child's permanent place of residence. A business address, work place address, a childminder's address will not be accepted.

A relative or carer's address can only be considered if they have legal custody of the child. In these circumstances, evidence of legal custody/parental responsibility, e.g. a court order, must be supplied.

Children of UK service personnel

Families of service personnel or Crown servants returning from overseas to live in Croydon can apply for a place without the child being resident in Croydon. However the application must be accompanied by an official letter that declares the relocation date and unit postal address or quartering area address.

Shared custody

It is the local authority's expectation that where there is shared parental responsibility for a child, parents will agree which parent has the main responsibility before completing their application form. Where parents are separated and share custody, the parent with whom the child spends most of the school week (which will normally be the address where child benefit is payable) should make the application. An application can only be made from a single address and only one application can be made for each child.

If the parent making the application lives at a different address, a letter of explanation should be given and signed by both parents. Custody issues cannot be resolved by the local authority. If parents are going through a separation or a divorce and do not live together but share parental responsibility over a child, the local authority will disclose details of a child's application if one of the parents who shares parental responsibility requests this information. This will however be subject to the receipt of legal documentation e.g. court order which confirms the shared parental responsibility.

Parental responsibility and private fostering

Parental responsibility is defined by the Children Act 1989 and amended by the Adoption and Children Act 2002. Parental responsibility in its simplest form is 'all the rights, duties, powers, responsibilities and authority which by law a parent of a child has in relation to the child and his property'.

People can obtain parental responsibility by seeking a parental responsibility legal agreement, obtained with the consent of all persons with parental responsibility or by a court order, or when a child is placed with them for legal adoption.

Step-parents, grandparents and other close relatives do not have automatic parental responsibility, and can only acquire it through a legal agreement or court order. If you are a distant relative or no relation to the child you are caring for, it is likely that you are a private foster parent. In law this means you must tell your local council you are caring for the child and also you must tell the child's parents (or the person with parental responsibility) about the application for a school place and obtain their permission. You can find more information on parental responsibility at www.gov.uk/parental-rightsresponsibilities.

Fraudulent applications

Croydon takes very seriously any attempt to gain an advantage in the admissions process by giving false information. Your address will be checked by reference to your child's primary school records as well as other council records such as electoral and council tax register record(s) and, if necessary, by a council officer visiting your address.

The local authority will investigate applications where there are any doubts about information provided by parents or where information has been received from another source. This may lead to prosecution.



Looked-after children and previously looked-after children

Looked-after children are defined as "children in public care at the date on which the application is made.' For secondary transfers, the date will be taken as 31 October.

Applications from children in public care (looked-after children) must confirm which local authority is responsible for the child and be accompanied by a letter from the child's social worker confirming their legal status and that he/she will still be looked-after when the child is admitted to the school.

Applications from children who were looked-after, but ceased to be so because they were immediately adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or a special guardianship order) must be accompanied by a letter and/ or documentary evidence from the child's social worker, advisory teacher or other relevant professional confirming that the child was looked after immediately prior to the order being made as well as the date.

The letter must also confirm the date a previously looked-after child ceased to be looked-after and the date of the adoption order, residence order, child arrangements order or special guardianship order which led to the cessation of 'looked-after' status.

Any court order must be accompanied by a letter from the child's social worker.

Please note that any confirmation/evidence of looked- after and previously looked-after status received by this local authority will be forwarded on to the school preferences or the local authority where the school is situated in the case of out of borough schools.

Admission of children outside their age group

Parents of gifted and talented children, or those who have experienced problems or missed part of a year, for example due to ill health, may request that their child is exceptionally admitted outside their age group. The admission authority of a school must decide whether or not the individual child's circumstances make this appropriate on educational grounds. Such requests will only be agreed in exceptional circumstances. Parents have a statutory right to appeal against the refusal of a place at a school for which they have applied. However, this right of appeal does not apply if parents are offered a school place which is not in their preferred age group.

All requests should include recent professional evidence of the child's circumstances which make education outside the age group necessary. Each admission authority will expect to see evidence of an individual child's educational need, rather than general factors which relate to a wider group of children born at a similar time. They will want to discuss with parents the impact of the child being educated with children of a different age.

Parents requesting admission to an age group below the child's actual age should submit an application for the child's actual age group before the closing date on 31 October 2018. The request for admission to a different year group should accompany the application. This enables the application to be processed and a school place secured in the child's actual age group if the request is refused by an admission authority. If the admission authority approves the request, the parent will be advised to re-apply in the following year and provide a copy of the decision letter. However there can be no guarantee of a place being available at the school, as this is dependent on the number of applicants that year. It is not possible to reserve a place for the following year. Parents are therefore advised to include alternative school preferences on their application.

When will I know the outcome of my application?

If you applied online and on time you will receive an email notification about the result of your application on

1 March 2019.

Important Information

Please note that an outcome letter will not be sent to you in the post. You will be able to view the result of your application online as well as accept or decline the offer made to your child, by logging into your e.admissions account.

Accepting or declining your offer

You must accept or decline the offer by 15 March 2019 to ensure you secure a school place for your child.

If you receive an offer at your first preference school, we will **automatically** record this offer as accepted unless we receive notification from you that you wish to decline the place.

The online outcome information will give you important advice on what to do next if you have been unsuccessful in securing an offer at one of your preferred schools or have been offered an alternative school which you did not list on your Common Application Form.



Waiting lists

Oversubscribed Croydon schools will maintain waiting lists. Your child's name will automatically be placed on the waiting list for any school which was a higher preference on your application form than the school you have been offered.

Applicants' requests to be added to the waiting list for lower preference schools will not be allowed if an offer of a first preference school has been made, unless there has been a change in your circumstances which will need to be supported with relevant evidence. Requests to be considered for lower preference schools can be made through the in-year application process – that is from September 2019.

If you need to find out your child's position on the waiting list, please contact the admission authority for the school or the borough in which the school is situated after 22 April 2019.

If you would like more information about the reason why your child was not offered a place at a higher preference school you should contact the admission authority that is responsible for admissions to the school. Details of the different admission authorities for schools in Croydon are listed in this booklet (see pages 16-17). If the school is outside this borough, the admission authority will be either the local authority in which the school is situated or the school itself. Contact telephone numbers for neighbouring local authorities are also included in this booklet (see pages 24-25).

The School Admissions Code requires admission authorities to order waiting lists on the basis of the priorities of the published admissions criteria and not, for example, on a first come first served basis.

Each individual admission authority decides how long their waiting list will be held but must keep a waiting list open until at least 31 December 2019. Please refer to each school's admission policy.

Parents/carers need to be aware that if their child's name is on a school's waiting list, their place may go up or down the list depending on how the admissions criteria applies to others on the waiting list.

Appeals

If you have been refused a place at your preferred school, you are entitled to appeal and attend an appeal hearing in front of an independent appeal panel.

The panel will be made up of three or five members and none of the panel members will have any connection with the local authority or any of the schools in your case. The panel will include at least one person who has experience in education (non-lay member) and at least one person who does not have experience in education (lay member). If you wish to appeal against the decision not to offer your child a place at a Croydon school you must contact the school for details of their appeal arrangements.

Any school admission appeal must be in writing. If you decide that you wish to appeal you must do so by the deadline date stated by the school or by the local authority for an out of borough school.

- Set out as many reasons as you can for wanting a place at your preferred school.
- Try to explain your reasons as fully as possible as to why your child should be given a place despite the fact the school is full.
- You should also attach copies of any written supporting information, letters, documents, or evidence which you would like the appeal panel to consider at the hearing.

Special arrangements apply to children with an Education, Health and Care Plan – see pages 28-29.

APPLYING ONLINE – STEP BY STEP GUIDE

BEFORE YOU START

- Decide your order of preference before you start the online application.
- **Get an email address** you need one to apply and you need to be able to access it in March 2019. If you don't have one go to www.googlemail.com and click 'Create an account'.
- If you have trouble with computers get a friend, relative or your child to help you make the application.

LOGIN OR REGISTER

01. Go to www.eadmissions.org.uk



02. If you have applied before (e.g. for an older child), login with your email and password from your previous application. Choose 'Login to your account'. Skip to number 07 and check your details are still correct.

If you can't remember your username or password click the 'Forgotten your username or password?' link

03. If this is the first time you have applied you must register your details and email address. Choose 'Register to apply online'.




- 04. Enter your details and click 'Register'.

Save this email for future reference – you will need to log back into the system to make changes and on offer day.


06. Click the link in the email, enter your username or email address and password, then click 'Login'.

- **08.** Click **'Start application for New Child'** button.




9. Enter your child's details and click 'Next'.




- 10. Choose your preferred school from the list. Change the local authority if the school is outside Croydon. Click 'Add this school'.

- **15.** Check your application carefully. To make changes click 'Back' at the bottom of the page.
- **16.** Read and agree the declaration by clicking in the box.
- 17. Click 'Submit Application'.
- 18. You will receive a confirmation email with your application reference number (e.g. 306-2018-09-E-001234). This email is proof that you have submitted your application successfully.



Every primary school will have a special educational needs co-ordinator (SENCO) who has specific responsibility for pupils with SEND. He/she will be able to advise you on arrangements for secondary school admissions for your child.

Pupils Receiving SEND Support.

If your child is currently receiving additional support for any special educational needs or disability but do not have an Education, Health or Care Plan (EHCP), the arrangements for secondary school admissions are the same as for all pupils and you must complete the online application form.

If you are in the process of requesting an EHC needs assessment for your child or he/she is being assessed to consider whether an EHCP is necessary you still need to follow the arrangements for all children.

Pupils with Education Health and Care Plans

If your child has an EHC plan the 0-25 SEND Service manages the arrangements for secondary school placement.

At the beginning of the summer term the SEND service will send you a letter explaining the arrangements and timescales for finding a suitable secondary school. This letter will include a form which you must complete naming your preferences for secondary schools.

The review of the EHC plan in Year 5 will include consideration and recommendations of the type of setting that would best suit your child's needs when they move to secondary school.

If your child is in a mainstream school now, it is likely that a mainstream secondary school will still be the most suitable setting.

Placement in an Enhanced Learning Provision may be considered. Enhanced Learning Provisions offer additional specialist support within a mainstream setting. Pupils attending Enhanced Learning Provisions split their learning time between their class group and a specialist setting within the school enabling them to access a broad curriculum while receiving the additional specialist support they may require.

In a few cases, placement at a secondary special school may be considered as the most suitable learning environment to help your child make progress.

The school preference form must be returned to the SEND Service before the end of the summer term. This is earlier than the deadline for applications for secondary schools for all pupils without an EHC plan. The earlier deadline gives the SEND Service enough time as possible to consider your preferences and liaise with schools to confirm a placement.

Once a school has been confirmed you will be notified and the EHC plan will be amended, naming the secondary school, no later than the 15th February.

Appeals process

If you disagree with the school that has been named in the amended EHC plan, you may wish to appeal this decision. Information about the processes for appealing the decision will be included with the amended EHC plan.

APPLYING FOR A PLACE AT A UNIVERSITY TECHNICAL COLLEGE OR A STUDIO SCHOOL

Applying for a place at a University Technical College or at a Studio School

Children born between 1 September 2004 and 31 August 2005 and who are currently in Year 9 are eligible to apply for a place at a University Technical College (UTC) or a Studio School for the September 2019 intake.

Croydon does not currently have any UTCs or Studio Schools but a full list of all 14+ schools in London and the surrounding area can be viewed at www.croydon.gov.uk/education/schools-new/utc

University Technical Colleges (UTCs)

www.utcolleges.org/utcs

University Technical Colleges are set up by universities as business and specialise in one or two technical subjects. In years 10 and 11, they offer a similar GCSE curriculum to a typical secondary school, including English and Maths, as well as their specialist subject.

Studio Schools

Studio schools are similar to UTCs in that they have employer involvement in the curriculum and focus on developing skills needed for employment, involving personal coaching and work experience, along a similar curriculum to a typical secondary school.

How to apply

Applications to some UTCs and Studio schools are coordinated by Croydon local authority and can be made online at **www.eadmissions.org.uk** by **31 October 2018**. You will receive the result of your application on 1 March 2019 by logging into your eAdmissions account. Please ensure you keep your login details safe so you can access your account.

A few UTCs and Studio Schools require parents to apply directly to them and therefore you must contact them for details of the application process and closing dates. Please refer to the list at www.croydon.gov.uk/education/schools-new/utc for more information.



In-year admission to secondary schools

Applications for a secondary school place outside the normal admissions round are treated as 'in-year' admissions. The process for making such applications depends on whether you are applying for a place in:

- A secondary school(s) in Croydon (excepting Harris Academies), in which case you will need to complete an 'in-year' Common Application Form (iCAF) from Croydon Council, as set out below.
- A Harris Academy in Croydon, in which case you must apply direct to the academy, as set out on the academy's website.
- A school outside of Croydon, in which case you will need to contact the home local authority, who will provide information on how to apply.

Croydon's iCAF

Croydon's iCAF is available to complete online at www. croydon.gov.uk.

Croydon's **iCAF** allows applicants to name up to a maximum of six preferences, and you must rank the schools in your order of preference. The **iCAF** must be fully completed for it to be treated as a valid application.

Supplementary Information Form (SIF)

Some schools also require a SIF to be completed. Please refer to the school's website for information on their requirements for a SIF. Where a school does require a SIF to be completed, these forms are available on the school's website. A paper copy can also be requested from the school. However, a SIF will only be considered valid if you have named the school on Croydon's iCAF.

Croydon's school admissions team

Croydon's school admission team check the iCAFs to ensure they have been completed properly. They also validate the address, and then forward the child's details to the Croydon schools named on the form.

Governing bodies' decisions

The school's governing body considers each application in accordance with their published admissions criteria, as set out on their website.

Outcome of your in-year application

The school will notify the local authority of the outcome of your application and will contact you directly to discuss admission arrangements.

If your child is offered a place at a school which you have listed as a lower preference school on your in-year application, he/she will not automatically be placed on the waiting for your higher preference schools. You will need to complete the 'waiting list request form' available on Croydon Council's website at https://www.croydon. gov.uk/education/schools-new/school-admissions/ in-year-admissions/in-year-secondary if you wish your child to be added on the waiting list for any of your higher preference schools.



Privacy Statement

Croydon Council will handle the information you have provided in line with the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR). Where we are unable to secure a school place through the normal admission procedures, we may also share the information you provide with the Fair Access panel. Under the General Data Protection Regulations, you have the right to make a formal request in writing for access to personal data held about you or your child.

The School Admissions Team's main method of communication with you will be via email and where the information sent to you contains personal data it will be will sent using secure email. It is your responsibility to provide the School Admissions Service up-to-date contact details and to keep them informed of any change of circumstances.

Croydon Council has a duty under the Children's Act 2004 to work with partners to provide and improve services to children and young people in the area. Therefore, Croydon Council may also use this information for other legitimate purposes and may share this information where necessary with other bodies responsible for administering services for children and young people.
