- **Design and create a rocket.** Remember that the launch apparatus will be attached to the opening of the bottle, so the rocket stands up-side-down.
- Your designs will need to fulfil a range of criteria.
 - 1) Use a 1.5L or 2L soft-drinks/water bottle (with screw-head intact – **diameter of 23mm**).
 - 2) The body of the bottle needs to be intact to be partially filled with water.
 - 3) The design needs to be aerodynamic otherwise it will struggle flying.
