Impact:

- The school had a successful Croydon Athletics competition, with more children reaching the semi-final and final than the previous year.
- Teachers are continuing to gain confidence in teaching PE and are continuing to use the 'Real PE' lesson plans and resources.
- The swimming lessons for Year 5 and 6 have been effective, allowing more children to access this life-saving skill.
