## Step 1: Pronouns

### National Curriculum Objectives:

English Year 4: (4G1.5) [Choosing nouns or pronouns appropriately for clarity and cohesion and to avoid repetition](#)

### Differentiation:

**Developing** Questions to support the ability of identifying nouns and personal pronouns (e.g. I, he, she) within simple sentences, replacing repeated nouns with a suitable pronoun and being able to identify which noun the pronoun has replaced. Word bank sometimes provided.

**Expected** Questions to support the ability of identifying a wider range of nouns and pronouns (e.g. they, everybody), replacing repeated nouns with suitable pronoun and being able to identify which noun the pronoun has replaced. Word bank sometimes provided.

**Greater Depth** Questions to support the ability of identifying a full ranges of nouns and pronouns, replacing repeated nouns with suitable pronoun and being able to identify which noun the pronoun has replaced. No word bank provided.
