Your task: To create a piece of pop art, inspired by Andy Warhol

What you will need:

- Either a print out of the drawing page below, or a piece of blank paper and a ruler.
- Pencil
- Something to add colour with – colouring pencils, crayons, felt tips, paints – you choose!

What is Pop Art?

Pop art was short for 'popular' art. It became popular in the 1960s. Pop artists were inspired by everyday things that they found in the world around them, such as packaging, newspapers, comic books and photos of famous people.
