"AAARRRGGGHHH!" yelled the farmer and ran off. He ran to the village. The King was sitting in the sun in his old chair.






"Why are you running?" asked the King.






The Papaya That Spoke

"A papaya spoke to me and then my dog spoke too!" said the farmer.


"That can't be true," chuckled the fisherman.

"AAARRGGGHHH!" yelled the farmer and ran off as fast as he could. He sprinted until he came to a field.


In the field, was a shepherd with his hungry goats.

Later that afternoon, the chair suddenly spoke to the King, "I agree, there is no such thing as a talking papaya!"









