What was the date of D-Day?	
Which countries were involved?	United Kingdom, Canada and the US Australia, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, France, Greece, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway and Poland
What was the purpose of D-Day?	D-Day. The American and British invasion of France was a top-secret mission called Operation Overlord. When they landed on the beaches of Normandy on June 6, the goal of every soldier was to drive the German military back.
What helped the mission to be more successful?	The impact of Operation Fortitude played a key role in the success of the D-Day landings. Hitler sent troops out of France into Norway convinced the Allied invasion would take place there Operation Fortitude helps illustrate the vast dynamics of Operation Overlord and the cost of a successful invasion .
Why was D-Day considered a turning point in the war?	On June 6 1944 the Allied Forces of Britain, America, Canada, and France attacked German forces on the coast of Normandy France. With a huge force of over 150,000 soldiers, the Allies attacked and gained a victory that became the turning point for World War II in Europe.
What problems did the Nazis face?	Issued on 3 November 1943, Hitler warned of 'consequences of staggering Germany's air force and navy could do little to resist invasion Waffen-SS formations were regarded as the best German forces in Normandy . As the clock wound down, some on the German side welcomed the chance to face the Allies.

Why was D-Day considered a turning point in the war?	D-Day was considered as a turning point in the war because the Allies could start to free the countries that the Germans had taken over.
What problems did the Nazis face?	The problems that the Nazis faced were: being tricked by the Allies and not being able to go to all the countries/facing barriers

How did D-day impact the world?

D-DAY forced the Germans to fight a two front war again just as they had in WWI. Yet again the Germans could not handle war on both sides of them. BY the end of June 1944, about a million Allied troops had reached France.

D-DAY

How did D-DAY LAST?

D-DAY was just the beginning. The Battle of Normandy lasted for twelve more weeks. Allied forces aimed to expand the area under their control capture key locations such as the port of Cherbourg and wear down the enemy's strength.

WHAT IS D-DAY?

Troops from the UK, the US, CANADA and France attacked German forces on the west coast of northern France on 6 June 1944. Largest military invasion and land operation.

How did D-day end?

By the end of August 1944 the Allies had reached the Spence River, Paris was liberated and the Germans had been removed from north western France.



Why was D-DAY so important?

The D-DAY invasion is significant in history for how it played in WW2. It marked the turn of the tide for the control maintained by Nazi Germany.
