Reception



Reception have been playing number games to deepen their understanding of numbers and to develop their mathematical understanding and reasoning. The children enjoyed taking turns to roll a die labelled 1 or 2 to see which player would be the first to clear the counters from a tens frame. This also provided opportunities for children to describe their emotions when they 'lost' or 'won' a game and learn how to support their partner if they felt disappointed when they didn't win a game.

Year 1

Year 1 had a fantastic time at Lloyd Park, exploring local fauna and creating art inspired by Andy Goldsworthy. We also applied our Geographical knowledge of physical and human features to plot a map of the park.



Year 2

In Science we explored lifecycles. We learnt that life cycles are simply the different life stages in an organism's life. Both plants and animals have life cycles. A life cycle is the journey of a living thing from beginning to end. In science we worked in groups and we used clay to show the different lifecycles of butterflies and frogs. We then presented this information to the rest of the class. Can you think of any other life cycles?

Year 6


