Reception

Reception delighted in making observations of the caterpillars which arrived in the setting last week. The children enjoyed watching them grow and change to become beautiful Painted Lady butterflies. A few tears were shed as the children watched them being released back into their natural habitat.















In Art, Year 1 have started learning about Pablo Picasso and his style of art work called Cubism. They had fun recreating some of his art work in the style of his selfportraits. They are now very proud to see their art work up on display.

The children also celebrated Refugee Week by making welcome posters for refugees who have been displaced. The children wrote positive messages and attempted to make posters using colours that will make refugees happy to look at.







Year 2 have been learning about levers, pivots and linkages in DT. We learnt that a lever is something that turns on a pivot and that a linkage is a system of levers that are connected by pivots. We made levers and then connected them to form a linkage.

Using our knowledge of levers, linkages and pivots, the children designed and made moving monsters. Their fantastic linkages enabled their monsters to move. Aaaaah watch out!







Year 3 have been investigating how pyramids were built in Ancient Egypt.

We were given two theories: were they built from the top down or the bottom up?

Based on evidence of how large each block was we decided that they would be too heavy to lift and slide if pyramids were built from the top down.

We learnt that a more sensible theory would be that builders used rollers to manoeuvre the blocks and used ropes & a pulley system to build pyramids from the base upwards.

We have loved learning about Ancient Egypt and the ways the civilisation is so different from our own now.


















Year 4 explored the Thames barrier in Geography by making one of their own in groups. They had time to plan and create their barriers. We then tested them to see how strong they were.


